
A plan, or roadmap, for how we can help each and every student achieve success.

Why does the CBE have an Education Plan?



Literacy The ability, confidence and willingness to engage with language to acquire, construct and communicate meaning in all aspects of daily living.


Indigenous Education Holistic Lifelong Learning The value and importance of Indigenous ways of being, belonging, doing and knowing.


