our location

For those of you who are not familiar with this structure, let me tell you a little bit about it. There are actually two buildings on this site – the 10 floor office tower and the historic Carl Safran School. The buildings are joined together by a space that is referred to as “the link”. These two buildings are the worksite for over 600 CBE employees and 4 privately owned businesses. We have now been in this building for two years.

The room that we are sitting in, which is located in the link, is referred to as our Multi-purpose Room. Although many service units use this room for a variety of meetings and events, the room is most known for the location that the Board of Trustee holds their Public Meetings in. The area in front of me is where Trustees and members of Administration sit. There are screens located throughout the room, so that regardless of where you are located, you can see the meeting. Please remember that you are welcome to attend any public meeting, or if you prefer, who can watch our meetings on your computer as we both livestream and record them.

Thank you for taking the time to come to this meeting this evening and for your ongoing support of students and public education. You are a valuable resource within our school district and this year trustees have been very excited to work more closely with you. ## background

This year, we've done a number of things to improve communication between school councils and the Board of Trustees.

Our first Council of School Councils meeting was held in October. We gathered some important feedback at that meeting and we are very grateful for all the school council representatives from across our system who shared their thoughts on how we can better communicate.

Earlier in the year, we met with business and community leaders, like our Mayor and the Chief of Police, and asked them what they thought was important for the future of education. We shared their insights at a series of meetings we hosted in February.

At those meetings in February, we met to discuss system-wide issues. We listened to you and we will share some of what we heard this evening.

What we've learned this year is that the more we listen, the more we understand the rich diversity and complexity of our system. There is not one easy solution to the complexities we face as we govern this large system.

## this evening's agenda

Trustees appreciate your feedback. We find it very valuable, and we hope that you will continue to provide it to us. Tonight we will be sharing what we have learned from you and your fellow parents. We will present information about the 2013-14 budget, provide an update on the ATA agreement process, and discuss issues our system faces regarding capacity and finding the right space for all of our students. We'll share information about how you can get involved in the upcoming school board trustee elections, and finally, we will provide an opportunity to talk with you individually.

In our conversations with you this year, you have asked us to be mindful of how much paper we use. For tonight's meeting we wanted to be respectful of your request, so you will notice that **most** information will be displayed on the screens, rather than giving you a hard copy. There are however a couple of documents that we felt would be important to provide for you this evening.
