







Context of 2021-22

- 2021-22 school year impacted by global pandemic.
- Characterized by:
 - Required transitions to online learning based on COVID-19 cases (designated by AHS)
 - Delayed return for students from winter break
 - High percentage of student and staff absenteeism due to illness
 - Unfilled substitute teacher positions over the course of the year.
- Impacted continuity of learning, body of student evidence of learning





AERR Highlights

High school completion rates continue to increase.



Students' PAT and Diploma Exam results are consistently higher than the province.



CBE students reported being more engaged in their learning at school than students in the province as a whole.

Attendance

- Key predictor of achievement
- Area of focus for monitoring
- Ongoing adjustments and follow through at classroom, school and system level

Achievement

- Diploma and PATs show stronger results than students across the province
- Early literacy and numeracy assessments identify key areas of focus for intervention
- More CBE parents, students and teachers satisfied with broad program of studies than the province



Learning Excellence



Areas of focus by student cohort

- Phonological skill development for kindergarten students
- Attendance and academic achievement for students who self-identify as Indigenous
- High school completion for English language learners

Next steps


- Implement screening tools in kindergarten to build understanding and targeted actions in schools and across the system
- Address early literacy and mathematics structured support
- Continue to support students with attendance improvement
- Enhance teacher understanding of English Language Learners' culture/cultural identity, language proficiency learner profile, interest and readiness levels

What to Expect - Report Cards

- This fall, the CBE began implementing new curriculum.
- Some of the learning outcomes in the new curriculum are new or may have previously been taught in later grades.
- Some grades may be lower than what was previously achieved.
- It may take more than one school year to build the foundational skills required to demonstrate new learning outcomes
- Students still have the opportunity to build on their previous knowledge and achieve success
- Teacher will continue to respond to the needs of students during this transition







Provincial budget February, 2023
