On Feb. 25, the [provincial government announced its new budget](#). In response, the Board of Trustees released a brief statement today.

“The CBE is encouraged by the Minister’s statements that school board funding will not be negatively impacted due to the pandemic-related decrease in student enrolment this year.

We look forward to receiving our individual funding profile at the end of March when we can develop a better understanding of what the budget will mean for CBE students in the 2021-22 school year.”
