

Hub Online Approach to Learning: Grades 10-12

The hub is a learning approach that has been created for the 2020-21 school year for families choosing to have their child remain at home due to COVID concerns while in-school classes have resumed. This will allow students to remain registered at their home schools while receiving course instruction through a format of online instruction and independent work. This learning approach will require parent involvement and assistance. Students will be supported by specific teachers assigned to the hub through the use of D2L by Brightspace and/or Google tools. Instruction will be provided through real-time, on-line teacher instruction with all students registered in the hub course, pre-recorded videos and printable resources. Due to available resources, hub online learning is available to CBE students only.

Unlike emergency at-home learning that took place in the spring of 2020, hub online learning requires students to meet all the outcomes in the Programs of Study. High School will offer courses in the Sciences, Math, English Language Arts and Social Studies, as well as Physical Education 10 and CALM. Courses offered will be based on student demand. Limited complementary courses will be offered and those complementary courses provided will be based on student demand and available space and resources.

This approach offers the regular program to all students in Grades 10-12. Due to the complexities of course delivery and available resources, French Immersion and Spanish Bilingual will be the only Alternative Programs offered through hub learning. These courses will run dependent on student demand. Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses will not be offered. Students registered in Alternative Programs will remain registered with their current schools while enrolled in hub online learning. A blended approach of in-person classes and hub online learning is not available.

September Start-up:

Online learning will begin for all students registered in hub the week of Sept. 8-11 with independent student work being made available. Real-time teacher instruction will begin the week of Sept. 14-18.

Technology requirements

Internet connection and a laptop, computer, or Chrome notebook. It is strongly recommended that all students take the *Essentials for Online Learning* course offered by the CBE at no cost. The course ensures participants are comfortable using the specific technology required for hub online learning. Registration information for this course will be available on our website towards the end of August.

Registration

Registration for Hub online learning, Sept. 2020 is now closed.

Moving from Hub online learning to in-person learning:

Parents / Guardians / Independent students need to inform the administration of their schools by **Jan. 8, 2021** if they wish to return to in-person instruction in February. Students may change from Hub to in-person instruction on **Feb. 1, 2021**. This is the only time students may move from Hub online learning to in-person instruction.

There is no movement from in-person learning to Hub online learning:

There is no movement from in-person instruction to Hub during the 2020-21 school year. However, the CBE is continually reviewing its support and opportunity for student learning. As a result, the decision to move from school to hub for Feb. 2021 may be revisited by Dec. 2020.
