

Level Up Calgary Season 2: Achievement Unlocked

Student Rubric

In Level Up Calgary Season 2: Achievement Unlocked, students assume the role of City of Calgary urban planners under the challenge theme, “Creating vibrant and sustainable public spaces that celebrate diversity, foster equity, and create unity for all Calgarians.”

Students will select from Fort Calgary, Calgary Public Library, Green Line, or Sien Lok Park and prepare a persuasive argument advocating for their vision for Calgary’s future. While each build site has its own provocation, all submissions must connect to at least one of the three resiliencies outlined in the [Resilience: Council's Strategic Direction 2023-2026](#) document.

The individual provocations are in the chart below.

Student Submission Criteria

Students will submit the two-minute video of their reasoning behind the design, judges will consider the following in the student's submission:

- Student introduction
 - First name and first initial of their last name
 - Enrollment grade and school name

- How does the design connect to the challenge theme by addressing:
 - Vibrancy** – *creating a welcoming, attractive downtown that encourage citizens and tourists to connect as a strong, diverse community* **AND**
 - Sustainability** - *Creating a thriving future for Calgary by making design decisions that consider aspects such as green spaces, public transportation, walkability, bike paths, vehicle charging stations, urban farming, community gardens, green buildings, rainwater harvesting, retrofitting buildings, renewable energy, and reducing emissions.*

- How does the build respond to the specific provocation of the chosen site:
 - Does the explanation make a strong connection to one or more resiliencies (economic, social and/or climate) in their own words?
 - How does the build make a positive change to the public space chosen that fosters diversity, equity and unity for all Calgarians?
