



Lord Beaverbrook High School Modernization Update for the school community - #6

Over the summer there has been a significant amount of construction activity both in and around Lord Beaverbrook High School. We are very excited about the progress being made and the changes we see happening to our school facilities. Here is an update:

Main floor:

1. **Complete** - Construction and relocation of the Business Studies classroom (NW corner of the school). Update to the instructional space for the adjoining Leadership program.
2. **Complete** - Construction and relocation of a new classroom space for the Adapted Learning Program. The program will be relocated to the SW corner of the main floor.
3. **In progress** – Construction of the Culinary-Professional Cooking Lab and adjoining classroom space.
4. **In progress** – Construction of the Cosmetology lab.

Second floor:

1. **Complete** - Construction and relocation of the Sports Medicine classroom (across the hallway into a larger instructional space.)
2. **In progress** - Construction of the Auto Body shop.
3. **In progress** – Construction of the Fabrication/Welding shop.
4. **In progress** – Construction of Building Construction and Woodworking shops.
5. **In progress** – Construction of a new computer lab (formerly Sports Medicine classroom.)

Classroom instruction will continue in all programs. In Fabrication/Welding, teachers have adjusted the order of units of instruction. Students will begin their course completing theory related activities and then move into the new shop for practical application. The Culinary-Professional Cooking program will relocate to Dr. Norman Bethune School (across the school field from Lord Beaverbrook), and access the fully equipped Foods lab for instruction. The Auto Body program will continue to operate and share space with the Automotive program.

Inside the school, students can anticipate safety barriers built around the construction areas. These barriers will be found mostly in hallways. Students are asked to be considerate of the workspace, and be considerate for each other as they move between classrooms and around the school.

Loss of food service in Cafeteria for duration of construction

There will be no food service available to students, staff or community for the duration of construction. Until completion, (anticipated November 2017) students should make alternate arrangements for lunch.

The cafeteria space will be available and accessible (as normal) during the school day for the duration of construction. Students can continue to access this space before school, on spare, at lunch, and after school.

North side of our school is out of bounds to students

This includes the street that runs along the north side of our school, ending in Ashley Crescent. Before, during and after school hours, students should not be in this area for safety reasons. Cooperation of everyone is appreciated.
