# **UPDATE:** Regular Program School Designation for Students Residing in Carrington

Dear Students and Parents/Guardians,

## <u>Update</u>

The portion of the Carrington community that is north of 144 Ave NW has been in the City of Calgary boundary for several years but was outside the CBE boundary. The CBE requested and received approval from Alberta Education to have the remainder of the Carrington community added into CBE's boundary now that residential development has started in that part of the community. Effective September 2022 the remainder of the Carrington community (north of 144 ave) will be within CBE's boundary. Please see the original Notice below for information on where students in Carrington are designated. It should be noted that both Cambrian Heights and Colonel Irvine are listed on the CBE's System Student Accommodation Plan (2022-2025) and there may be potential designation changes in the future.

#### **Original Notice**

The community of Carrington is located north of Stoney Trail between 14 Street Northwest and Centre Street North (see map on the back of this notice). The Carrington community is planned for a population of 16,800 to 17,800 people and will be built out over the next 15 to 20 years.

The Calgary Board of Education (CBE) would like parents to be advised of the following school designations for students residing in the community of Carrington.

### Information Regarding Transportation Services for Regular Programs

Until yellow school bus service is added to new communities, we provide a stop as close as possible in a neighbouring community. The initial bus stop location may not fall within the current CBE guidelines for travel distance to a bus stop. Stops and services are reviewed as conditions change in a new community. ملاحظة هامة: الرجاء ترجمة هذه المعلومات. New communities are regularly assessed for their suitability for transportation services. We ensure there is a consistent and safe path that is clear of obstructions which are frequently caused by construction supplies and equipment in newer communities. We need city maintained roads for the yellow school bus to enter, maneuver to pick up students and safely exit the community. Next, we look for an appropriate place for a bus stop that will allow for consistent safe loading and unloading of passengers. Once there is a safe path and a safe stop location, we add yellow school bus service to new communities.

#### Information Regarding Transportation Services for Alternative Programs

Students attending Alternative Programs may be designated to general transportation under the congregated bus stop model, or to Calgary Transit.

Congregated stops are used when students from the same or multiple communities congregate or gather at one stop to take a bus to their chosen school.

The bus stop may be well beyond reasonable walking distance from a student's home. Families are responsible for student safety to, from, and at the bus stop and may be required to arrange for transportation to and from the congregated stop.
