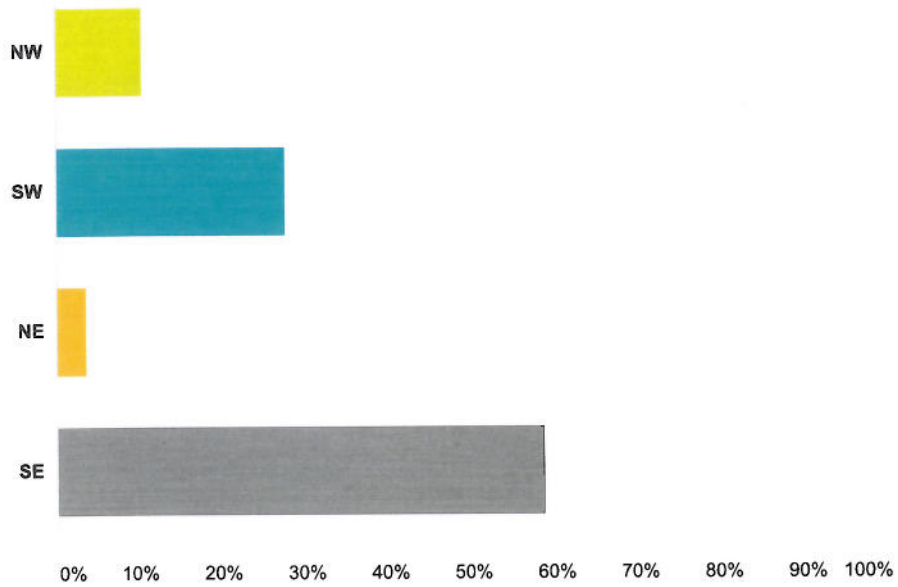


### Q1 What quadrant of the city do you live in?

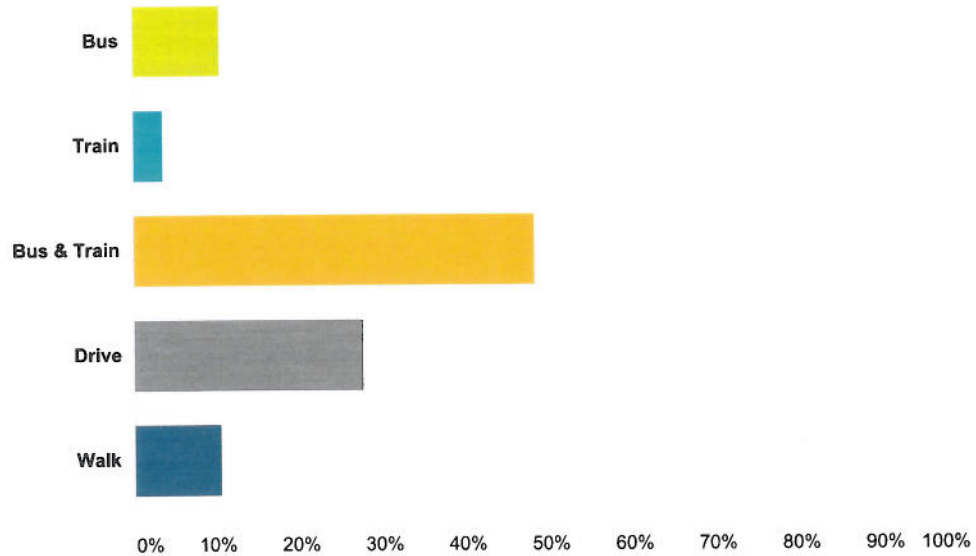

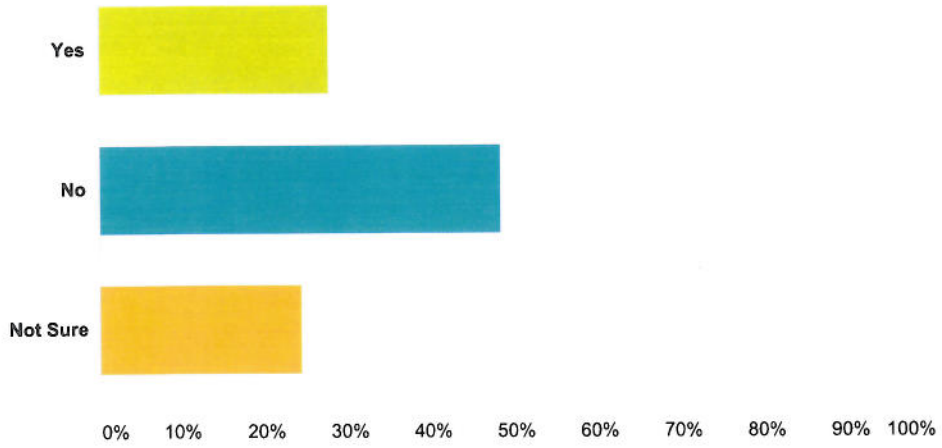

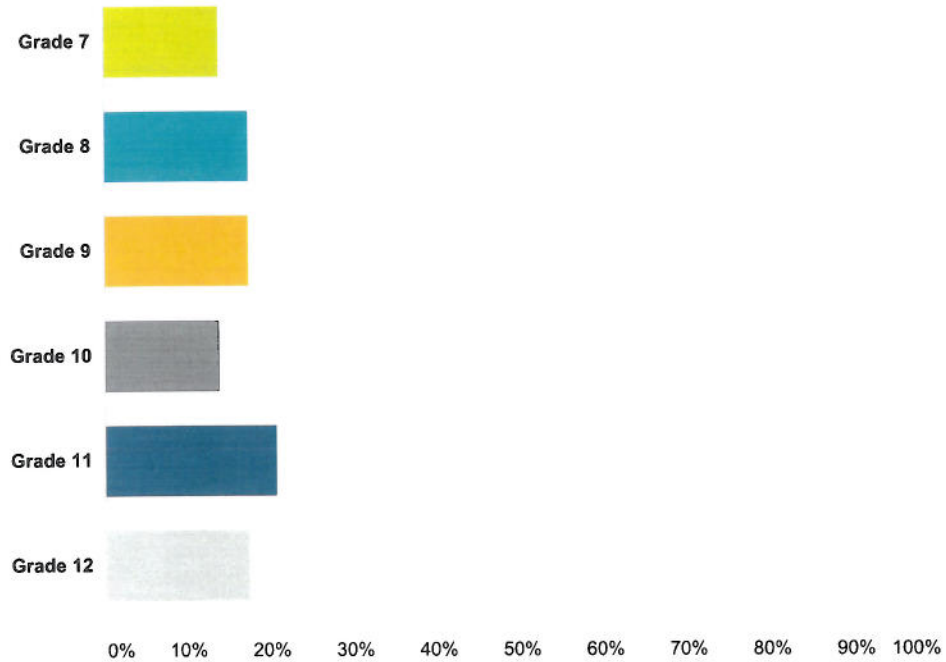
