Q1: What do you like about this scenario?

- Very similar to existing, so don't have too much concern
- Fee increase not terrible blow to me/my situation
- Quite like it
- Nothing (retains mid-day kindergarten)
- It's status quo for services
- Some people seem ready to increase fees
- Keeping things the same and still mid-day kindergarten

- Increased fees would be a challenge for families with multiple kids
- Don't think increase fees can be handled for many families
- The fees
- Already paying lunchroom fee, so all those fees really do add up



- Agree
- Not opposed to fee increase, but this is too much

- Add pay something for waivers (25% or pay what you can)
- Lower the fee
- Reallocate funding from administration to cover the gap
- Reduce the fee
- I agree pay what you can for waivers
- Some increase in fee, but not this much
- 40 minutes should be upper-limit ride time
- Increase walk distance to stop to 2km for middle school and up (Grades 7-9)

- Increased fees are a challenge with the economy
- Eligibility is misleading current scenario is not equitable for a rebate



- Add waivers the portion of the fee added to the scenario would reduce loss of revenue (i.e. 25% payment)
- Pay what you can
- Sliding scale (all agreed to this)
- Incremental fee increase
- There needs to be a financial rebate so Calgary Transit riders are not penalized for issues out of their control
- Need to review bus combining some buses actually pass others on their routes

- 1.6-1.8 km walk distance + fees all good

- Fees stay the same
- Distance and issue
- No one to drive

- Reduce distances for K-4 to 1.2 km
- People on waivers should pay 25%

Q1: What do you like about this scenario?

- Fees are affordable
- Difference between \$300-\$500 is not big
- Waiver % is included
- Fees stay the same

Q2: What don't you like about this scenario?

- All-day kindergarten would mean lower enrollment
- Unfair to some families (non-language alternative)
- A lot of changes
- It is very complex
- Almost unnecessarily complicated
- If alternative doesn't have easy access then it may be closed kids have to get there
- Risk that non-language alternative would be only accessible to families with time and money
- Some kids need to go to an alternative program; they don't go by choice
- No equity between people that ride yellow bus and people that ride Calgary Transit

- We like the sliding scale waiver system you could even go to 50% or more
- Schools should be where the kids are
- Rebate for Calgary Transit riders mechanics of how it is administered could be revised i.e. yearly



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Q1: What do you like about this scenario?

- Ok with congregated stops if planned well (i.e. placed near a park)
- I like the fees
- I like the waivers (pay what you can)
- Fees are perfect
- Agree with low ridership being eliminated
- The congregated stops were in place in the past and it was ok
- Like the fees reasonable
- Agree we have to address the need for funding somehow this distance is livable
- Like this one
- Fee structure
- Like reduced ride times
- Generally ok

Q2: What don't you like about this scenario?

- Concerned about congregated stops
 - Like the idea of them, but concerned about distance
 - o Need more info
- Nothing
- Eliminating mid-day kindergarten it's hard for those affected
- Don't like eliminating kindergarten (even though it doesn't affect me). Difficult to manage
- Don't like: Differentiating between language and non-language alternative. Everyone welcome to go, so should be treated the same

- If going to congregated stops, don't differentiate between language and non-language (congregated for all alternative programs)
- Add mid-day kindergarten (2 other participants agree)
- Prefer scenario 2 overall (but don't mind eliminating low ridership routes)



Scenario Number Discussed: 4

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Q1: What do you like about this scenario?

- More equitable
- Like reduced walk distance

Q2: What don't you like about this scenario?

- How realistic is this scenario, considering the length of ride times?
- The average ride time create one short ride and one long ride (i.e. last student on the bus on the way to school would be last off on way home)
- People may choose a school because it is closer
- Don't like that we don't know about bell times
- Big jump in fees
- No family maximum

- More certainty around ride time
- Lower ride time
- Consider all-day kindergarten on alternating days
- Grade 5-9 can go further for travel distance
- Consistent bell times get rid of early dismissal on Fridays

Like increased partnership with Calgary Transit at an appropriate age

Q2: What don't you like about this scenario?

Increased walk distance and more money

Q3: How would you change this scenario to make it more acceptable?

- Make it even/same rate in the middle school. I.e. same fee across each grade regardless if you take yellow bus or CT
- Give people the option of having the younger sibling travel with older sibling

No one liked this

Q2: What don't you like about this scenario?

- Half day Kindergarten no mid-day busing
- No transit rebate
- Numbers in study differ from Edmonton Public why can't we do the same?
- Don't trust the numbers
- The fees

Q3: How would you change this scenario to make it more acceptable?

- Follow Edmonton Public's model re: alternative program busing
- Offer more alternative program locations less distance
- Negotiate with Calgary Transit on a less expensive pass for students
- Have a UPass or similar to U of C and Mount Royal

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Q1: What do you like about this scenario?

- Like consideration to utilize CT more their job is moving people
- Good to change culture of bus riders from a younger age

- It takes care of inequity problem by making it expensive for everybody
- Can't do a thorough analysis because we don't have all the information. The numbers could be wrong.
- 2 km walk zone assumes caregiver will accompany
- Can't assume that safety is associated to walk distance





Q3: How would you change this more acceptable?

scenario to make it

- Maybe a cheaper pass for kids on CT just weekdays
- Is there safety in "some" long distances i.e. no big roads
- Innovative solutions with CT are possible need time to sort them out
- Don't drop CT ideas do the time and math, determine possibilities
- CT will need to understand clients (kids) though
- Maybe on some days the kids could do online learning (i.e. "telecommute") rather than need to take the bus to school

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Q1: What do you like about this scenario?

- Believe this is a great scenario
- But it should move to CT as a charter service (i.e. CT to run the CBE transportation system)
- Like the travel distance to the stop
- Like the idea of talking to CT and exploring working more with CT
- Looking at other vendors

- Duplication of service
- Fees too high, especially for alternative programs add the lunchroom fees and a lot of parents wouldn't choose alternative programs
- Alternative programs would be out of reach for many creates an elitist system
- Even fees for regular program are too much
- Not crazy about this one in general



- Fees are "totally unreasonable"
- Lot of ambiguity needs to be addressed to even consider this scenario
- Don't like the way it's presented to negate any positive thoughts it's presented as worst-case scenario
- The fees are a total no
- Don't like different fees for different programs creates an elitist system
- Don't like eliminating mid-day Kindergarten service
- Grade 4 on transit is not OK (some middle schools start at Grade 4)
- Concerned about safety

- More concrete numbers
- Equalizing the fees (but not too high)
- Need more details
- Reduced fees
- If we had more info and fees lower this is maybe doable

Q1: What do you like about this scenario?

- Fees are less than 5a
- More reasonable increase

Q2: What don't you like about this scenario?

• Still not equitable



- Doesn't address difference between Calgary Transit and yellow bus riders
- Alternative programs are more money. Discriminative to those parents
- Ok with alternative fees being higher, but not for busing

- Separate school boards should collaborate
 - Could be flexible on holidays
 - Catholics have no early outs
- CBE should have the same early off days across the board
- Go to school longer on Wednesday and Thursday and don't go Fridays
- Eliminate the ½ day Fridays (should do with partnered schools if any)

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Q1: What do you like about this scenario?

- Fees are lower than 5a
- Travel to stop is good
- Don't mind the fees a compromise
- Fees are waived
- Like in general

- Two levels of fees
- Don't like eliminating mid-day kindergarten
- Allow waivers to pay something
- Don't like walk zone to school
- Don't like differentiated fees
- Fees too high
- Don't like two-tier fees



• Fees a bit too high

Q3: How would you change this scenario to make it more acceptable?

- Low ridership routes can be moved to congregated stops
- Lower fees
- Eliminate lower ridership to congregated
- Eliminate low ridership to decrease fees
