# **Transportation Engagement Advisory Committee**

#### 1. TRANSPORTATION REVIEW

The current approach to student transportation is not sustainable and will be changed. Changes are aimed at ensuring a safe, efficient and cost effective transportation system providing equitable access for all students with available resources.

#### 2. MANDATE

The Mandate of the Transportation Engagement Advisory Committee (TEAC) is as follows:

- To provide advice on the structure and content of the 21016 CBE Master Transportation Strategy.
- To provide advice on effectively engaging stakeholders on the Strategy.
- To participate in the engagement process as defined by the engagement plan, in order to help collect information for consideration and analysis.

### 3. GUIDING PRINCIPLES

TEAC is committed to helping establish a safe, efficient and financially sustainable transportation program by:

- Honouring the CBE Values
  - Students come first.
  - Learning is our central purpose.
  - Public education serves the common good.
- Promoting and using clear guidelines and frameworks to enable well informed and sound decision-making.
- Respecting the confidentiality of all discussions undertaken in their advisory capacity.
- Ensuring CBE resources are aligned with decision making and accountabilities.

#### 4. COMPOSITION

Members include:

- a) Director, Planning & Transportation (co-chair)
- b) Project Lead, Public Engagement (co-chair)
- c) A Board of Trustees member.
- d) Manager, Planning & Transportation
- e) Planning Technician, Planning & Transportation.
- f) Three-four school principals with transportation programs, appointed by an Area Director. All grade levels are represented and there is a mix of regular and alternative programs.

- g) Three parents who have significant transportation programs. Collectively, parent representatives should possess a range of experience in transportation for children in elementary, middle and high schools, and at least one will be a school council executive member.
- h) Three parents whose children do not take CBE transportation to and from school.
- At least one parent of a student with exceptional needs who takes transportation to and from school.
- i) One representative from a charter bus carrier.
- k) One representative from the City of Calgary.

Resource persons to the Committee:

- a) Transportation Consultant, Planning & Transportation,
- b) Community Engagement Planner, Planning & Transportation,
- c) Communications Specialist, Communications Services,
- d) Administrative Assistant, Transportation Services (recording secretary).

Associate Committee members, to be engaged by the planning team bilaterally:

- a) One middle and one high school student who, daily, spends at least 20 minutes during a one way commute on a yellow bus (two sets of these representatives will be designated, a principal and an alternate).
- b) One middle and one high school student who, daily, spends at least 20 minutes during a one way commute on a city bus (two sets of these representatives will be designated, a principal and an alternate).

#### 5. DURATION

The mandate of the Advisory Committee shall terminate upon presentation of the CBE Master Transportation Strategy to the Board of Trustees.

## 6. QUORUM

Two thirds of members

#### 7. MEETING FREQUENCY

Meeting dates shall be established during the inaugural meeting.

#### 8. LIMITATIONS

The committee will take into consideration and adhere to:

- Operational Expectations,
- Administrative Regulations,
- System Student Accommodation Plan,
- Three Year School Capital Plan,
- Three Year Education Plan,
- Requirements of Alberta Education Policies and Regulations,
- Infrastructure and Transportation Policies and Regulations.

Advisory Committee co-chairs will take primary responsibility for ensuring these are considered.
