CALGARY – The Calgary Board of Education (CBE) Board of Trustees is pleased to announce that cousins Andrew Hall and Jeremy Bryant, founders of Mealshare, are the seventh recipients of the CBE's Legacy Award. The award will be presented at the Public Board Meeting on Tuesday, May 15.
