



Speech-Language Pathology Services



Speech-Language Pathologists (SLPs) are essential members of educational teams supporting students with speech, language, literacy and communication challenges to achieve their academic and personal potential. They enhance student outcomes by facilitating student access, participation and inclusion in the curriculum, as well as in the broader school environment.

Our Speech-Language Pathologists provide consultative supports to teachers and children in specialized classes. They also provide supports to children experiencing communication, language and literacy challenges that significantly impact their participation and learning in **kindergarten to grade 2**.

SLP services are also available to students with complex communication needs requiring **Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC)**.
