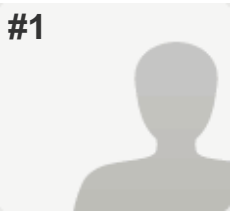

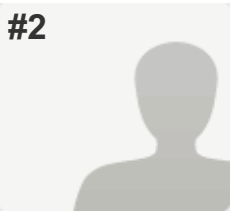
Are the boundaries for Eric Harvie school overlapping with Tuscany school? If so, are those in the overlapping boundary just able to choose between the schools?

I don't think that a Kindergarten aged child should be expected to walk 1 km or more to school. My child's shortest route would require that she walk through a green space along an unlit pathway, past a pond, a creek, and a (usually dry) storm water pond area, that are potential safety hazards as they can be very tempting to young children to explore. I am also very concerned that the last portion of that walk involves crossing Tuscany Way, which is a very very busy road (especially during the morning and afternoon rush) with no crossing lights at the Tuscany Way/ Tuscany Drive intersection. Walk zones seem to be designed for families where 1 parent doesn't work and is able to drive or walk with their children to school. Both parents work in our household, and we are struggling to figure out how our daughter will get to █ safely, every single day of the week.

Q4: Is there anything else we need to consider regarding walk zones as we move forward?

Crossing lights, and possibly even stop lights, will need to be installed at the Tuscany Way/ Tuscany Drive intersection. It is too dangerous to cross there in just the designated cross walk without lights.
